We very much welcome your views and are constantly considering them in all our efforts to develop the school. Therefore, we feel it important to share with you the actions we have taken or intend to take in response to your answers.

We have done lots of work on what **homework** should be like across each year group over the last year and I receive lots of positive comments about the freedom that 'Home Experiences' give you as a family. There is a book in the main reception with some examples of these for anyone to look at if you would like some inspiring ideas.

We recently focused a lot of our work around **Anti-Bullying**, with all children, staff and governors signing our school charter. One of our governors attended the assembly and talked to children about her job as a police officer and how bullying affects adult lives too.

Although only 63% of parents felt they strongly agreed or agreed, the school deals with bullying effectively, 22% of parents stated that they 'didn't know' as they had not needed to approach the school for support for bullying.

This year the new visual steps of consequence in each classroom has had a positive impact on **behaviour**. The visual reminder of the school values and expectations have enabled pupils to make better choices which haven't led to additional consequences. There are less pupils receiving detentions compared to last year with no exclusions made so far this year. We continue to have high expectations of how pupils behave in lessons and on the playground with at least one member of the Senior Leadership Team out on the playground daily.

We continue to urge you to contact us should you have any **concerns**. Your child's class teacher continues to be the first contact. After that, should you wish to discuss a concern with a member of the SLT, the following people are available.
